### **Neurosequential Model of Therapeutics Intervention**

*This research-based training program came out of a partnership with Great Circle and the Kindred Collective, both community non-profits aimed at promoting mental health in children and families. This training provides a foundational understanding of trauma and children's developing brains. In partnership with trained NMT practitioners, I was able to offer brain-mapping analysis to adopted children showing the lasting effects of prenatal trauma. The results of the brain mapping suggested targeted therapeutic services which I was able to negotiate with families.*

### **Trust-Based Relationship Intervention**

*This research-based training provides tools for educating parents and caregivers on communication practices to address complex developmental trauma in children. After an 8-week training, I was able to interact with adoptive and foster parents in the community to offer trauma-informed, research-based solutions to manage challenging behaviors with children.*

*This research-based intervention involves an interactive workshop in which participants integrate past, present, and future experiences into an integrative whole to make sense of difficult experiences.
